Muller Van Severen

consists of the Belgian couple Fien Muller and Hannes Van Severen. Since 2011 they work together to create highly stylized objects that appear to be produced with total effortlessness. With both Fien Muller and Hannes Van Severen being artists, it's natural that the collection sits somewhere between design and art. The design practice has been on an inspired quest for sculpturally interesting furniture objects, without losing track of its functionality.

It looks as if the designers draw with crayons in space. "We create furniture with a certain lightness so the background becomes part of the image", they say. After winning countless awards and collaborating with prestigious museum and galleries worldwide, Muller Van Severen is considered one of the most imagedefining European design teams of today.

Muller Van Severen has designed a set of cutlery which looks pure and functional yet uncompromisingly adapted to their signature style.

Every utensil consists of two parts: a shaft and a coloured metal plate on top which creates the handle.

Muller Van Severen, renowned for their strong colour selection, chose for blue, copper, brass and steel. A cutlery set entirely in one of these colours will appear classic, when the colours are combined, the tableware gets that typical playful Muller Van Severen feel. The simpler the object appears, the harder it is to make. It took us three years to stick the coloured metal plate on top of the handle which had to be laser-welded on the inside. The technique is laborious but did ensure us no visual disturbance on the outside, making this cutlery a refined set of design.

Fien Muller



Maarten Baas is

considered to be one of the most influential Dutch contemporary designers. He is often described as an "author designer," of which his works lie on the boundaries between art and design. His work is known as rebellious, playful, intellectual, theatrical and artistic. Baas' designs contain a huge amount of spontaneity and naivety. H e translates the human touch into a mechanically produced design objects. "In a quick sketch, beauty is often found", he says. "But those spontaneous lines are often lost in an industrial process." And so, Baas adds organic forms and wobbly lines to an otherwise very straight-lined design world. His work has been collected by leading museums such as MoMa (New York), Victoria and Albert Museum (London), Les Arts Décoratifs (Paris), Stedelijk Museum and Rijksmuseum (Amsterdam) and other prestigious galleries worldwide.


Dutch designer Maarten Baas shapes objects in a sketchy and nearly childlike way. The cutlery he has designed for valerie_objects materialises the spontaneous handdrawings of the designer. In a world where machines are built to produce straight lines, Baas' irregular shapes, like the wobbly knife-edge for instance, are quite hard to manufacture. The cutlery set consists of seven pieces: a table and a dessert version of knife, spoon and fork with an additional coffee spoon. All items are seperately available as well.



With this cutlery, the flat surfaces remain at the ends; the main part of the body is octagonal in shape. The set includes a table knife, fork, spoon and coffee spoon, made from stainless steel.


